The online calculator is here!

We are pleased to share with you a brand-new tool that will help answer the question we hear so often: How much will I pay when we switch to a single payer system in California?

The Healthy California for All Commission recently reported that a single payer system could save Californians \$500 billion in healthcare costs over 10 years while covering everyone with comprehensive care.

Starting today and using this tool, individuals will be able to get a sense of what their contribution to a universal publicly funded healthcare program would be versus what they are currently paying for health care.

The calculator is offered through a collaboration of the statewide <u>Healthy California</u> <u>Now coalition</u>, the National Union of Healthcare Workers, and (drum roll please) UCSF health policy professor Dr. James G. Kahn.

Rally to Stop Medicare Privatization

The San Francisco federal building on Friday, July 29, was a good place to celebrate the 57th birthday of Medicare--and to protest escalating privatization of the program.

Representatives from House Speaker Nancy Pelosi's office accepted a letter calling for a halt to the REACH program that would accelerate insinuation of care management plans run by profit-driven middlemen into traditional Medicare.
